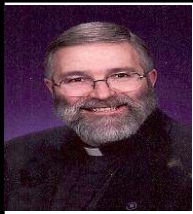

“On Death With A Wink”

Once upon a time I was afraid of death, and then I had a conversion. No matter I'd been a priest since I was 27 years old, I needed to let go of, and surrender that fear once and for all! November is the month Catholics remember their dead. All Souls Day begins the awareness that for a believer in Jesus Christ “there is only life and more life.” Death is vanquished and life has the final word.

A person who puts their faith in the Risen Lord Jesus might find comfort and truth in the words of John Oxenham: “For death begins with life’s first breath, and life begins at touch of death,” or Thomas Wolfe: “Death – the last voyage, the longest, the best.”

Sometimes in a funeral homily I may use that image of a voyage with this short story:

Dying

*“I am standing upon the seashore.
A ship at my side spreads her white
sails to the morning breeze.*

*I stand and watch her until
at length she stands like a speck
of white cloud where the sea and
the sky come down to mingle
with each other.”*

*“Then someone at my side says,
‘There she’s gone.’”*

*“Gone where? Gone from my
sight... that is all. She is just as
large in mast and hull and spar
as she was when she left my side
and just as able to bear her load
of living freight to the place of destination.”*

*“Her diminished size is in me not
in her, and at that moment, when
someone at my side says, ‘There!
She is gone,’ there are other eyes
watching her coming and other
voices ready to take up the glad
shout: ‘There she comes!
And that is dying.’”*

“And there she comes” might also fit with another image and a different word of consolation:

If a tiny baby could think, it would be afraid of birth. To leave the only world it has known would seem a kind of death. But immediately after birth the child would find itself in loving arms, showered with affection and cared for at every moment. Surely the baby would say, “I was foolish to doubt God’s Plan for me. This is a beautiful life.”

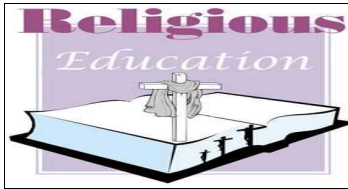

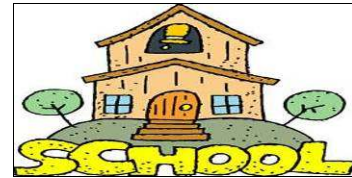
