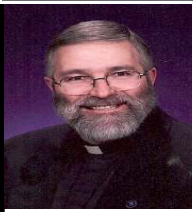

Dear People of Faith;

Advent the great season of wants and dreams, moves quickly, and certain themes emerge. Themes like “waiting”; hope and anticipation; prophecies; and now, this Sunday: “light.” Light is the central image of today’s Gospel as even winter approaches (12/22) and days are darker.

There are many ways to think about “the lights of Christmas”:

- Sister pokes her head in each room, offering a cheerful Good morning! She may pull from her canvas satchel a rosary or prayer card or small candy bar for any child she meets on her rounds of the elder-care facility. She delivers the magazines and stamps and notions residents have requested. Sometimes she will pull up a chair and listen to a resident pour out her fears and loneliness, his anxieties and disappointments. Sister offers consolation, assurance and whatever help she can. After a career as a teacher, administrator and leader of her community, (she is well into her seventies herself, but she says as) she is “vertical and mobile,” she will continue her ministry at the facility, a ministry that is *light*...
- She helps her mom with her first-grade religious education class at the parish. The kids adore her. She will take a child who is struggling with the day’s lesson and go off to their own little corner and work together until the child understands. More students than she realizes are able to offer the Lord’s Prayer because of her patience and understanding. This 13 year old would look puzzled if you said so, but what she does with the parish first graders is *light*...
- His no nonsense approach is legendary. If you want the straight, unvarnished truth, he will tell it to you, kindly, respectfully, but clearly. His estimates are exact, he takes responsibility for the few mishaps along the way to completing a job; he stands by his work. Oh, he could make a few more dollars cutting corners that would never be noticed, but that’s no how he operates. The quality of his work and his fairness in his dealings with clients are *light*...
- He is slowly going blind, but he wants to assist at Mass and help out at funerals for as long as he can. He is light to those who minister with him.

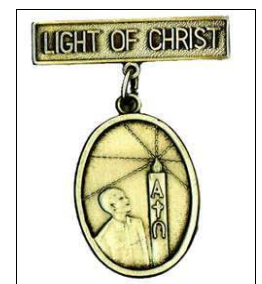

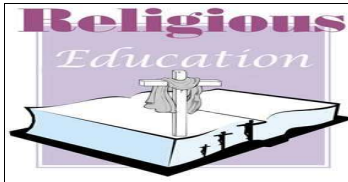

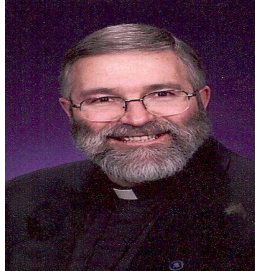
